

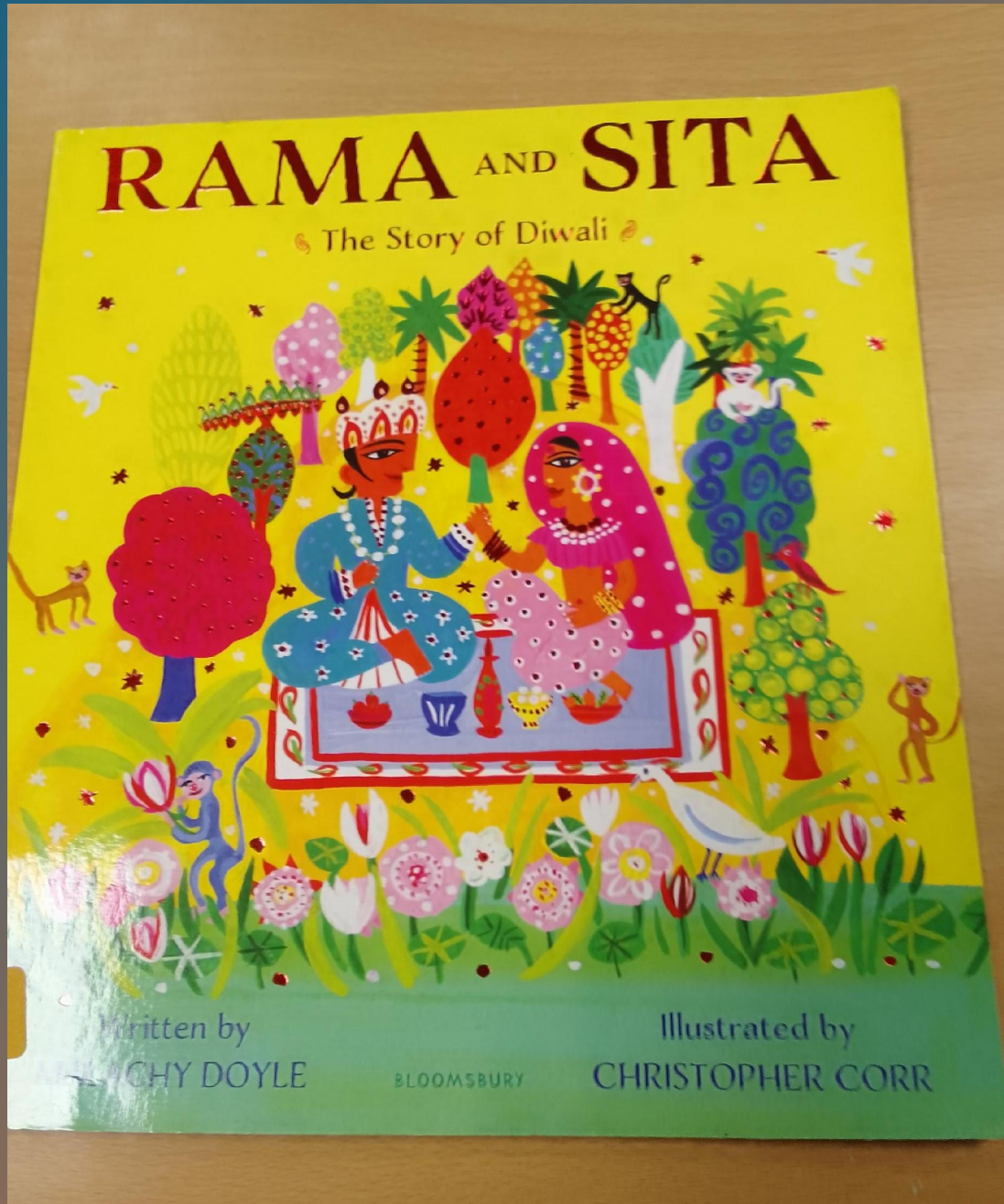
Y3K - Stories from Around the World

“I liked it when the princess was rescued. A good story should have a happy ending.” Adriel

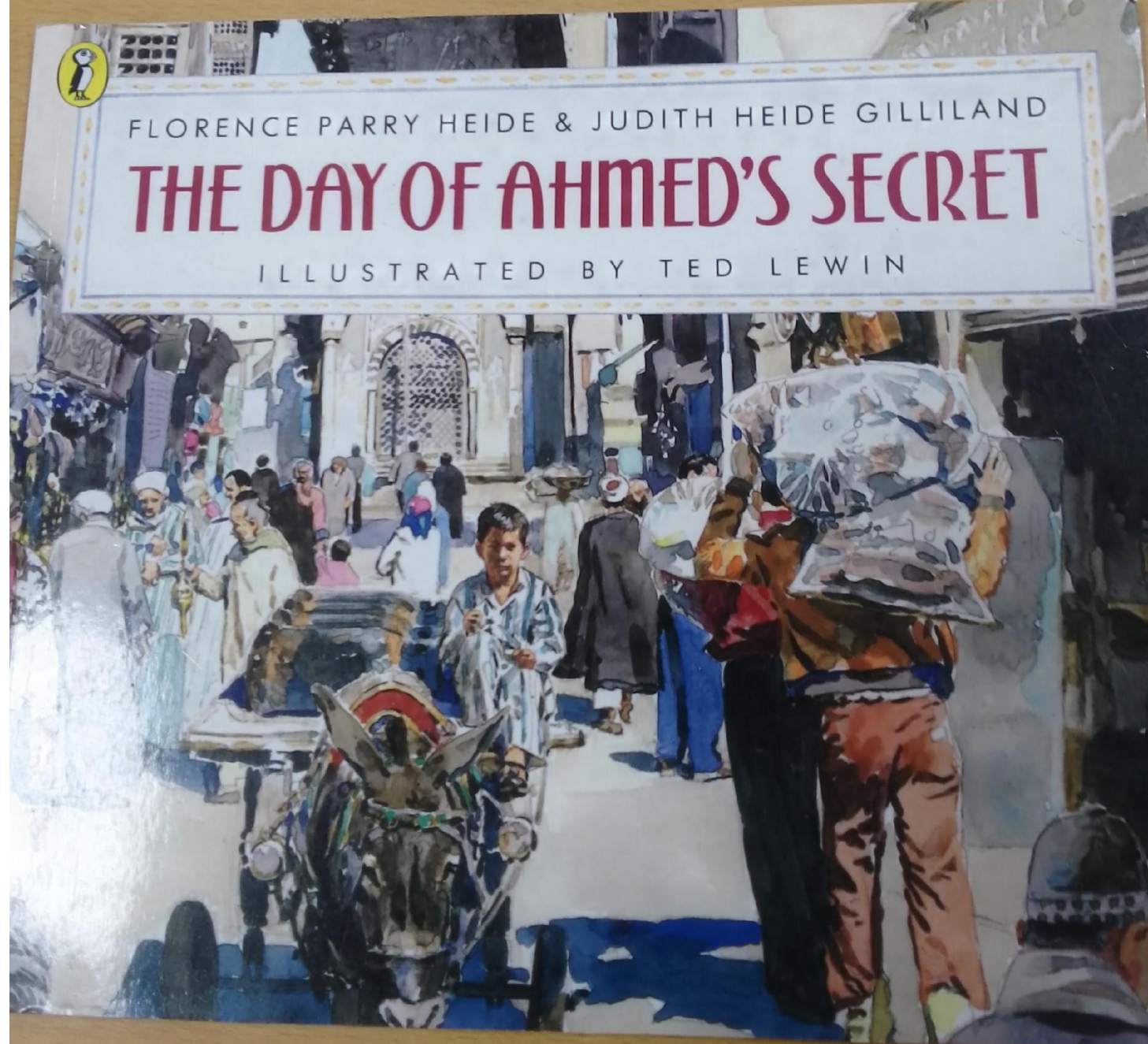


The secret in the story is the little boy learnt how to write his name, and he shared this with his family.

“I could imagine the jungle as Miss Knapp read the book.” Archie.

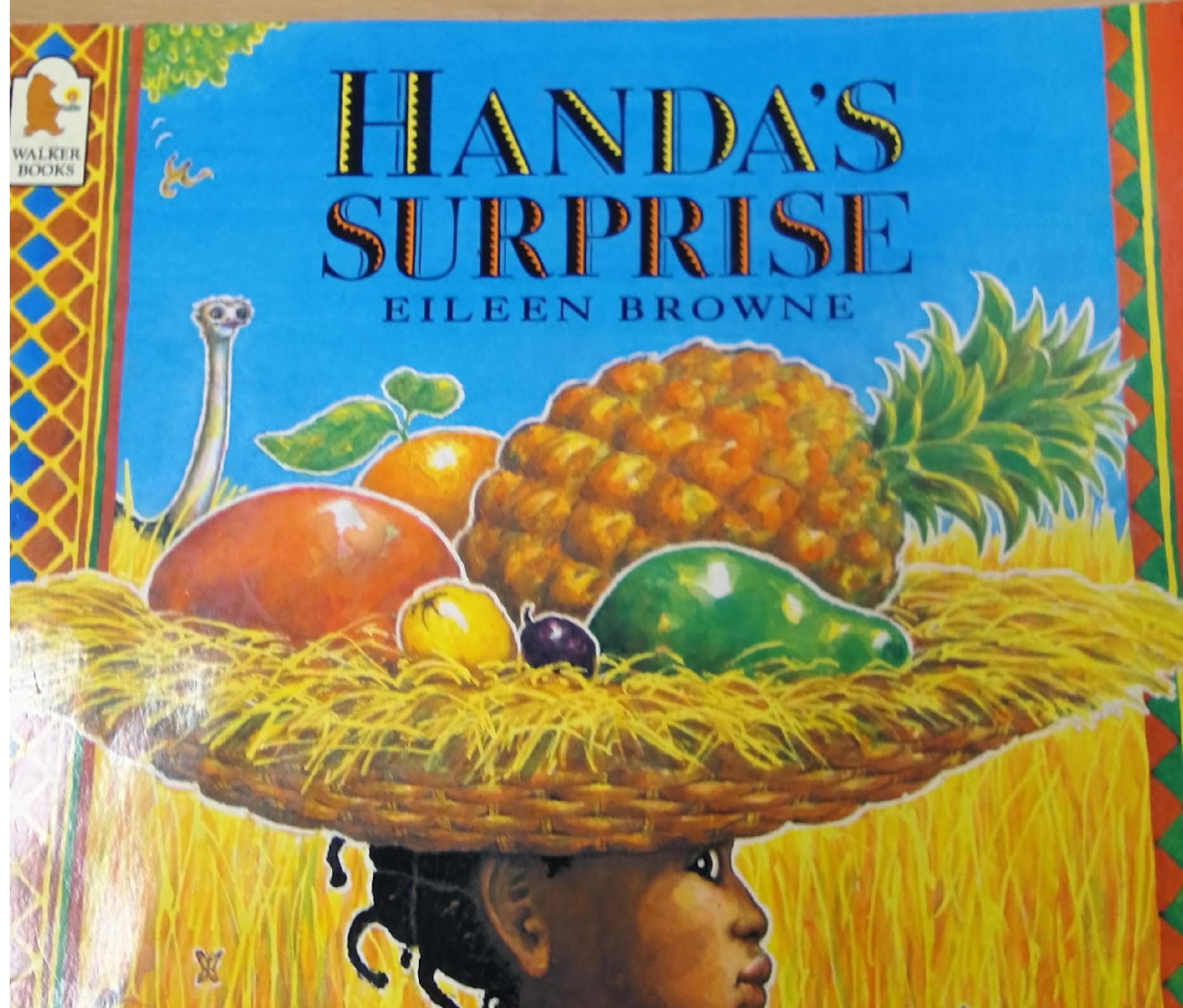

“I liked all the different patterns on the clothing. They remind me of clothes my family wear.” Adriel

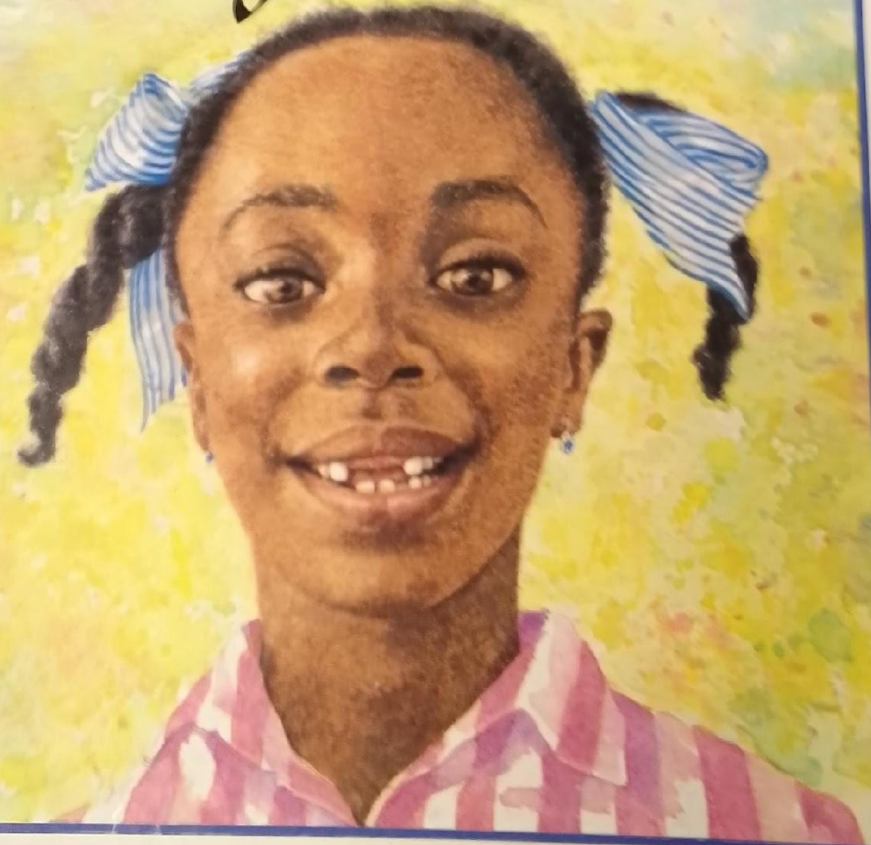

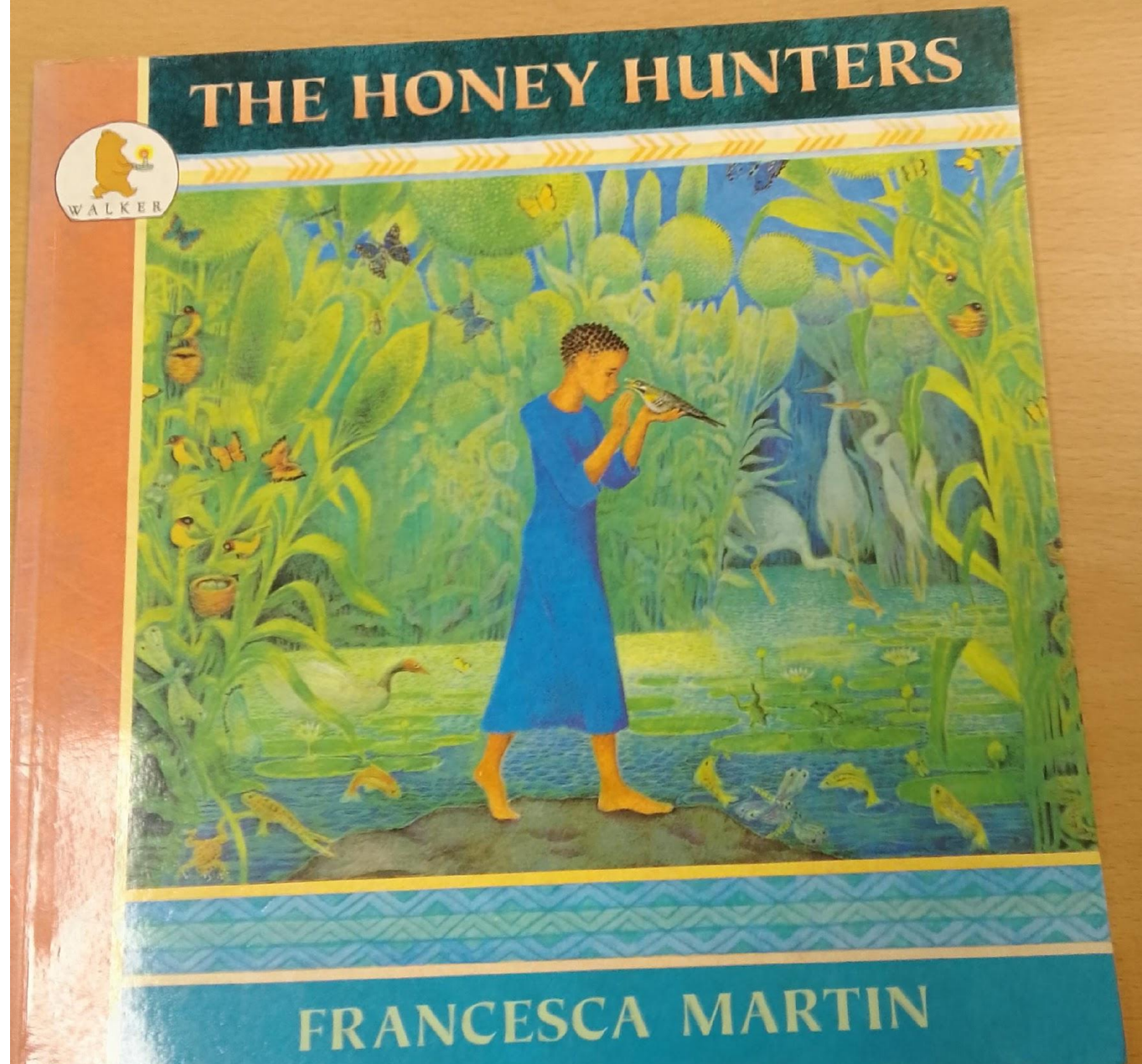


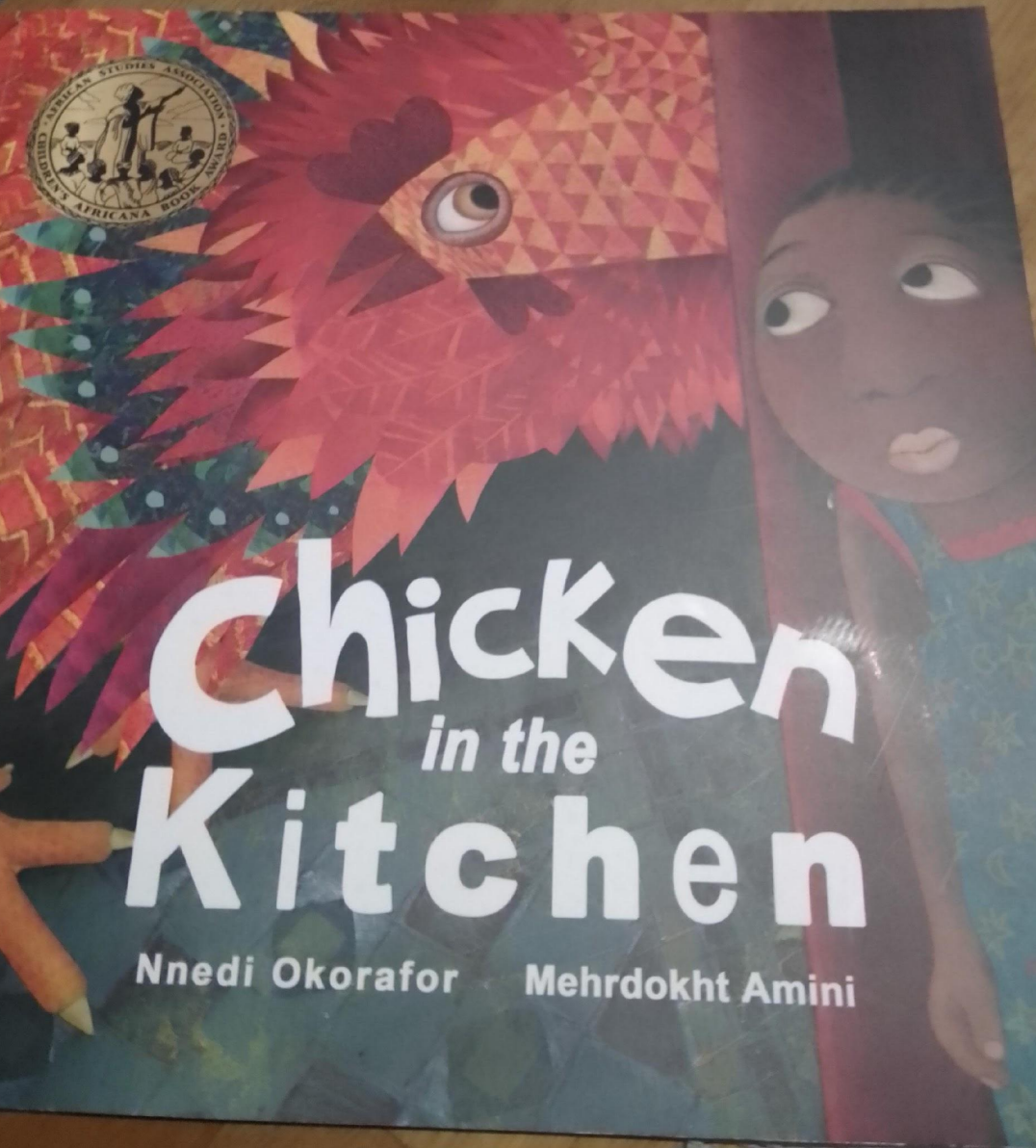
