

Visit to Zduńska Wola, Poland

Monday 19th to Thursday 22nd
May 2025

Aims of the Visit



- To make connections with pupils in a Polish school.
- Develop cultural awareness of a different country in Europe.
- To enhance interpersonal skills such as teamwork, communication and independence.

Opportunities For Your Child

- Present information about Lincoln/Bishop King to another school.
- Experience life as a typical Polish pupil.
- Expose themselves to new cultural experiences and food.
- Take part in a different travel experience within a structured project, with a high staff to pupil ratio.

Funding

- This will be a fully funded visit, through the government's "Turing" scheme.
- Travel and food expenses will be fully covered, and you will not be asked to contribute towards these.
- Support can be provided with sourcing the required travel documents. Please speak to Miss Melhuish or Mrs Carpino if you require help with these.

Accommodation

- We will be staying at the Biesiada Hotel in Zduńska Wola. Children will share a room with one peer.
- Children will eat breakfast and dinner at the hotel each day (lunch will be eaten at our partner school).
- A risk assessment visit of this hotel has been carried out by Miss Melhuish and Mrs Carpino to ensure that it is safe and appropriate.



Our Partner School

- We will be partnering with the “Nicolaus Copernicus Primary School No. 6” in Zduńska Wola.
- Prior to the visit, children will have opportunities to communicate and connect with pupils from the school.
- A bespoke programme of activities has been developed with staff from the school. Children from both schools will take part in these activities together.



The Application Process

- Spaces are limited for this visit so we cannot guarantee a space for every child.
- If your child would like to attend, they must write a letter to Miss Melhuish and Mrs Carpino outlining why they would like to take part.
- This letter must be handed to Miss Melhuish by **Friday 15th November 2024**.
- Please note, this visit is dependent on behaviour in school.
