Marie Louise Allen

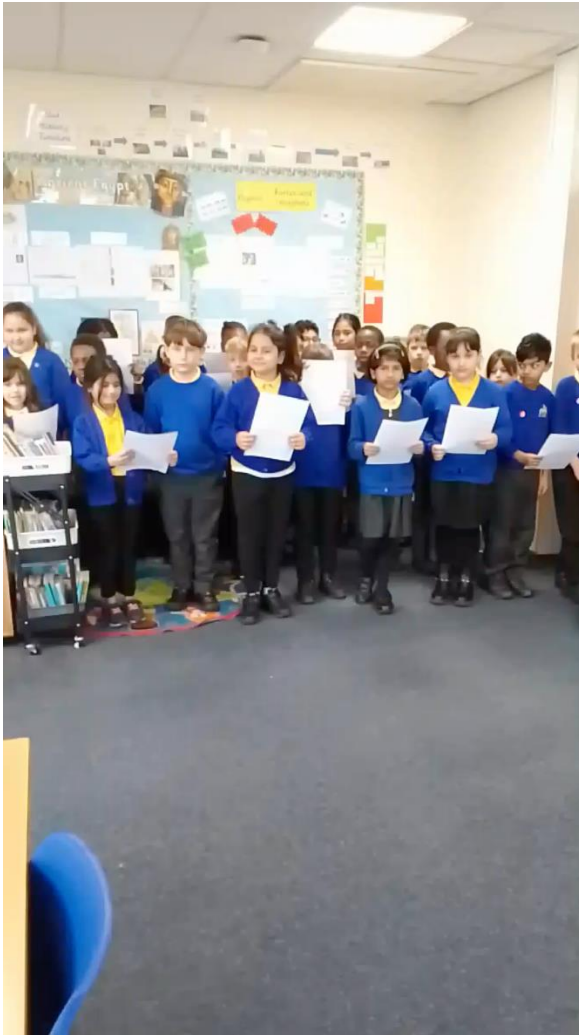
Snow makes whiteness

Boys can like pink, purple and yellow too.

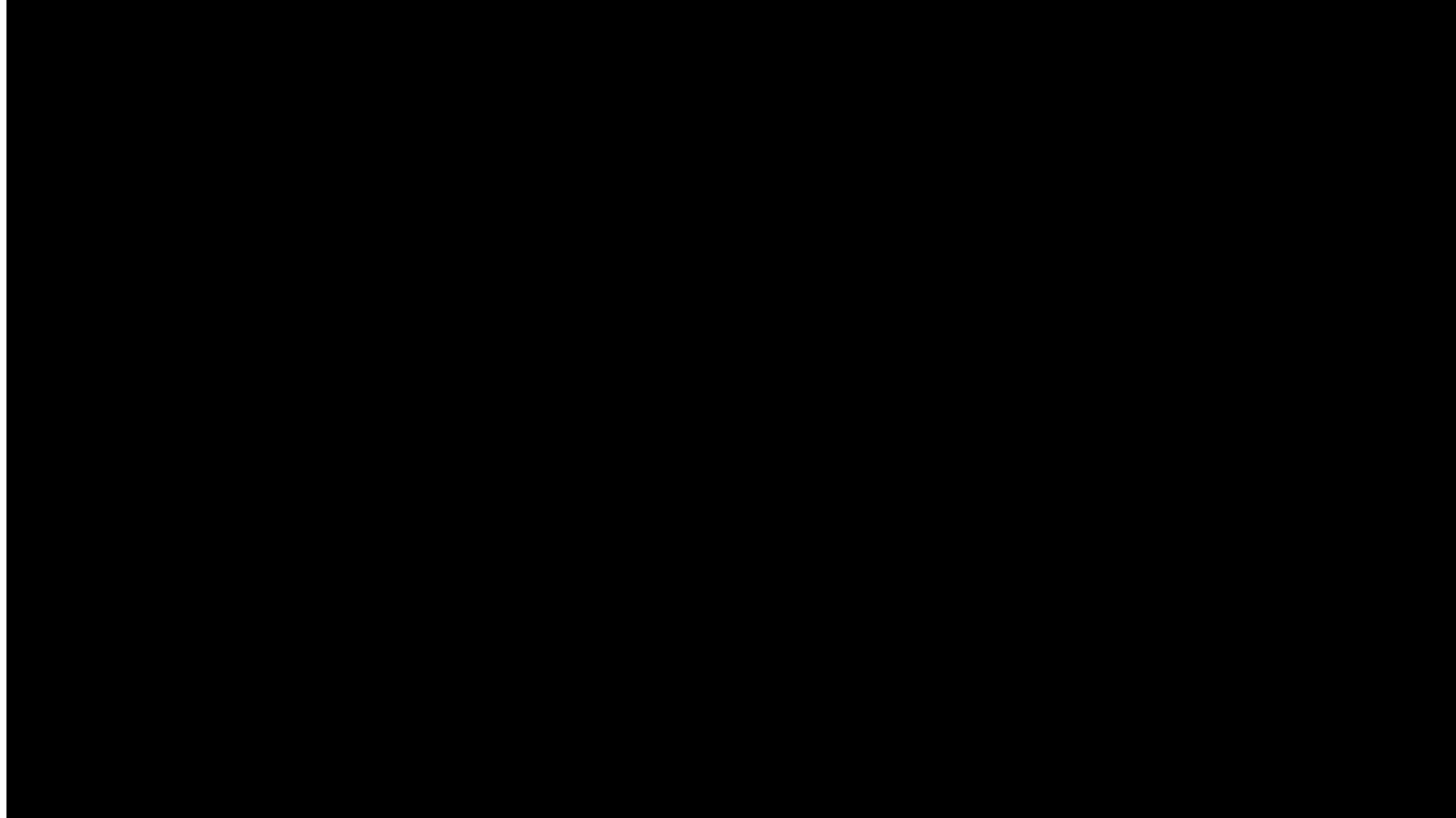
