'They are good at carrying.'

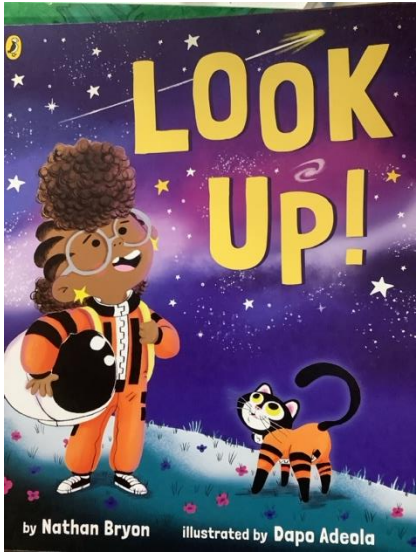
'The animals are naughty.'

'I haven't seen that animal before.'

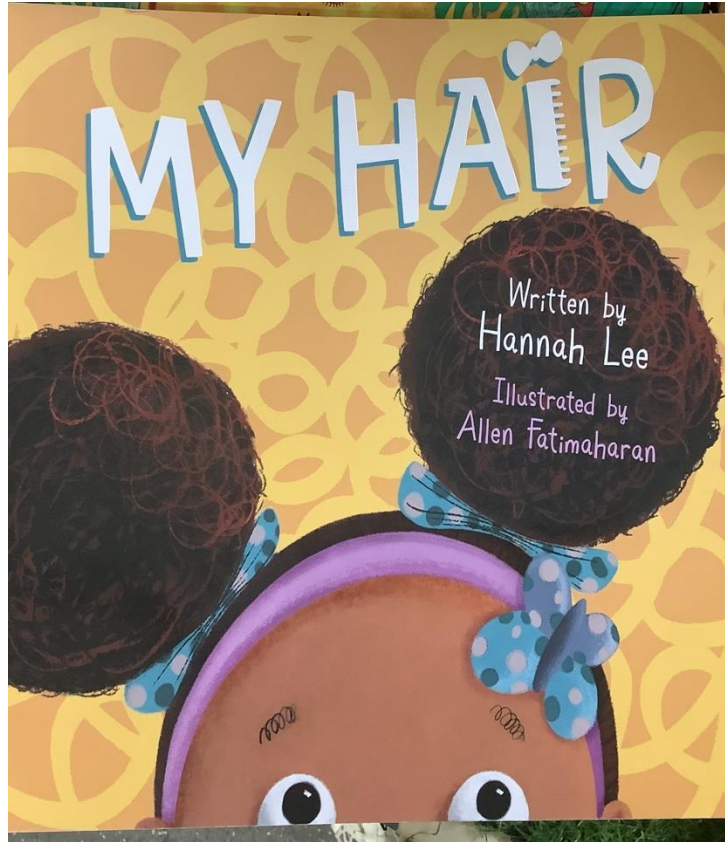
'Are they her pets.'

'It is hot, lots of sun there'

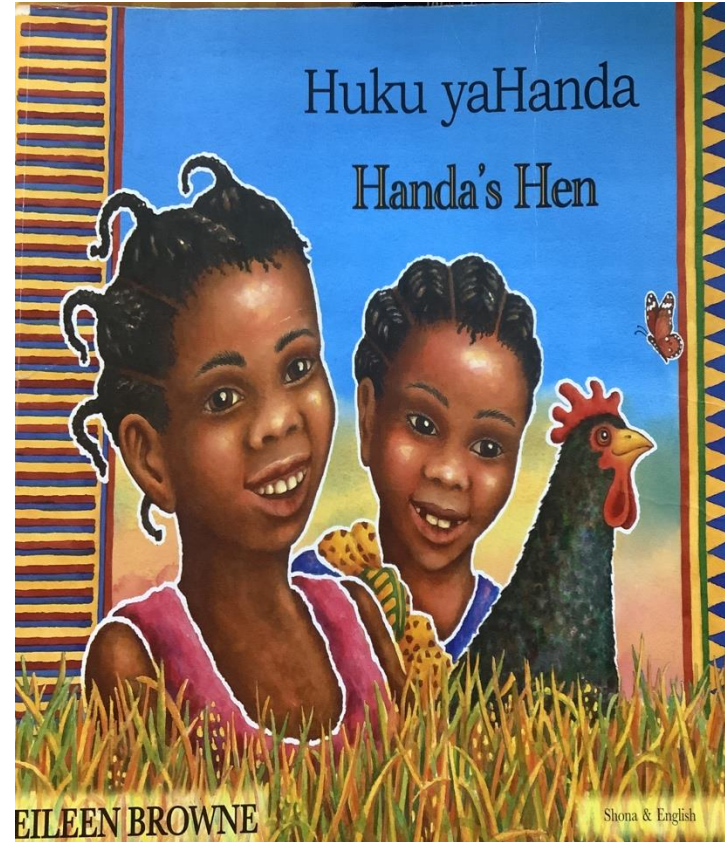
'Look at all the fruit.'



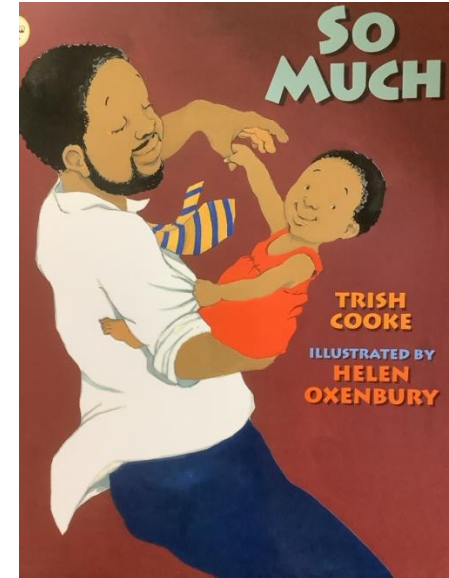
'She wants to be like her mum.'

---



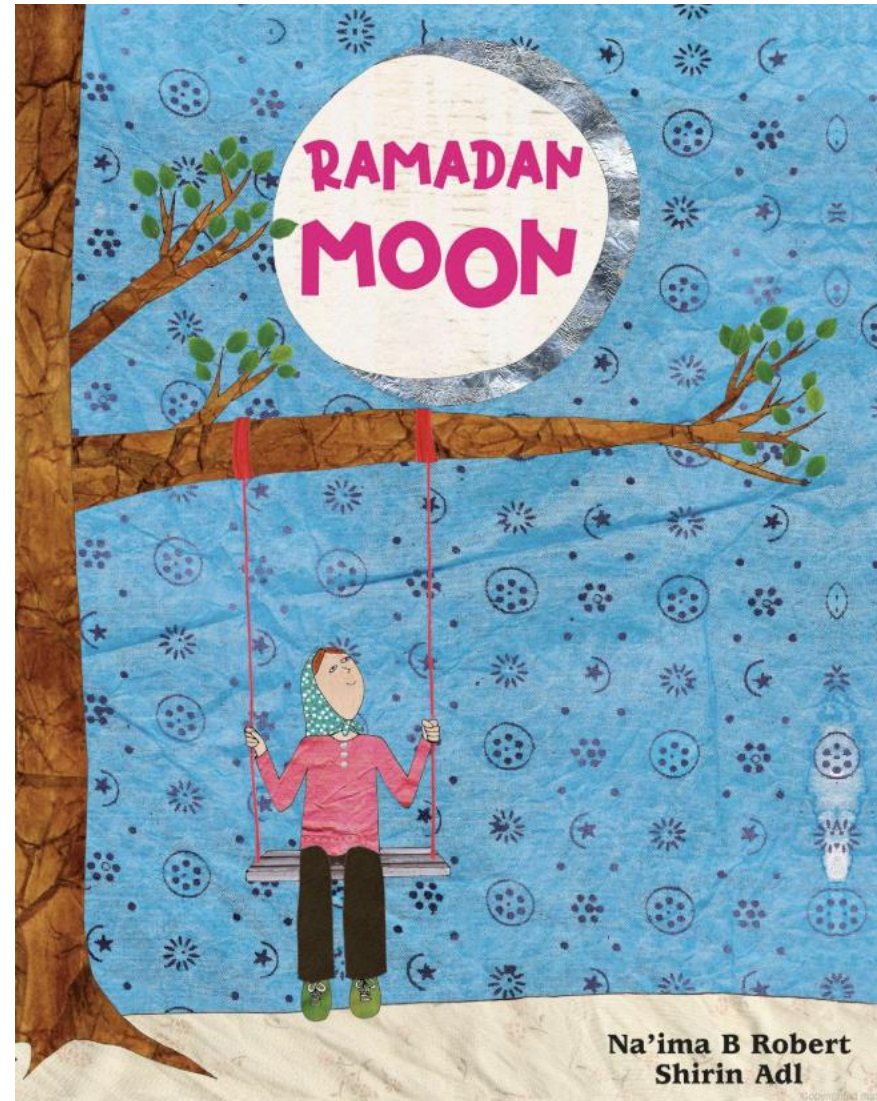
We read "Ramadan moon" and coloured bookmarks with a 'fable' theme.

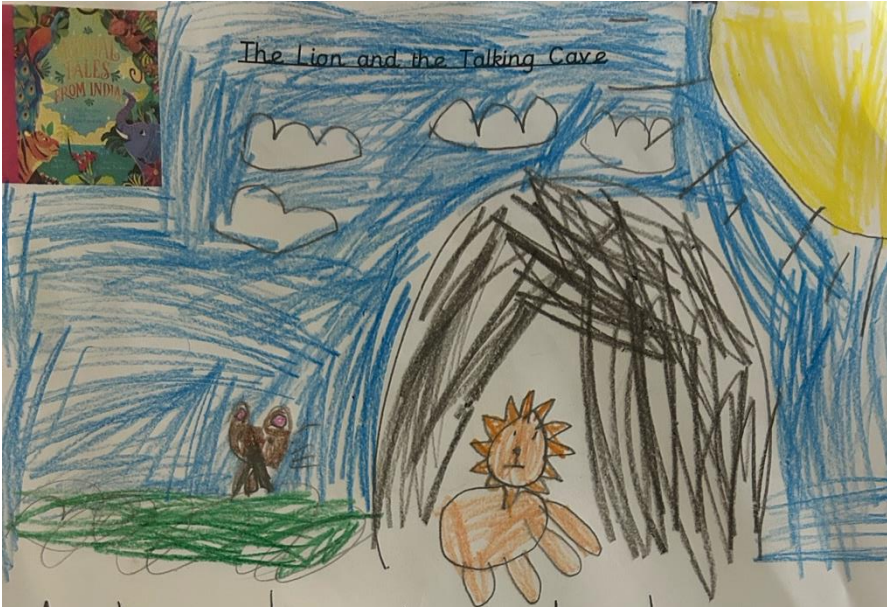
# World Book Day in Year 2

 the Talking Cave**'.

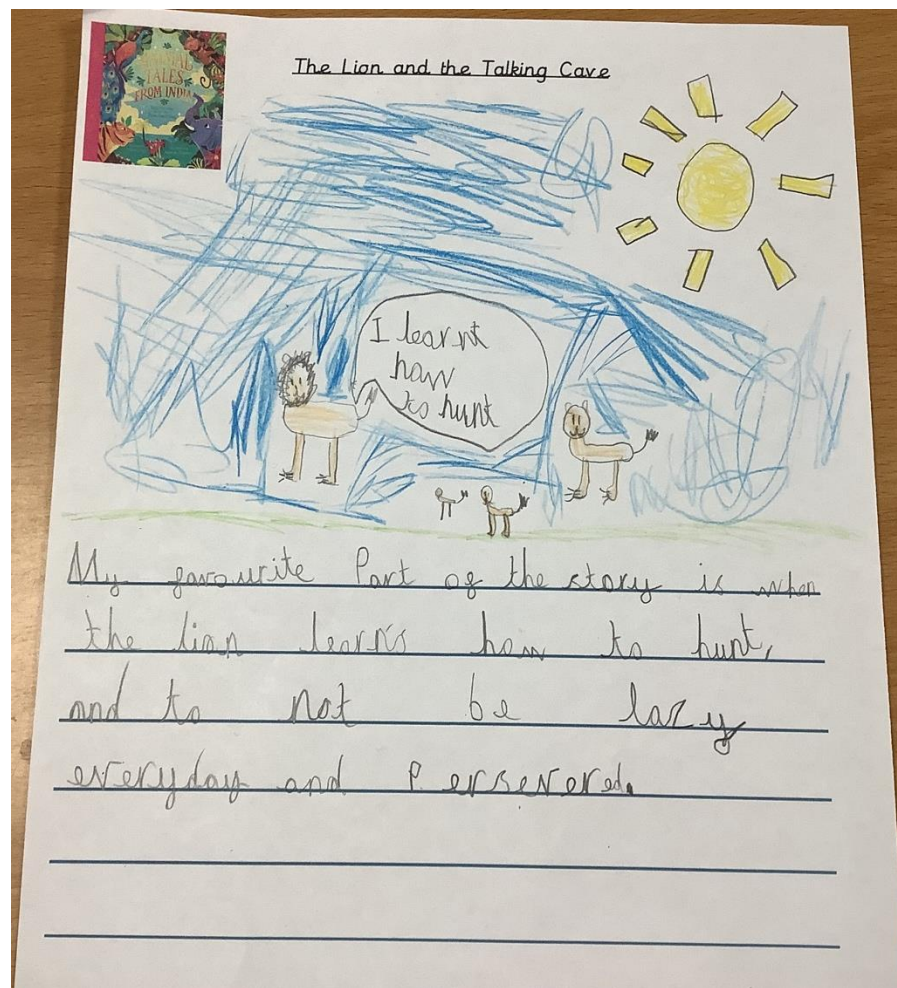
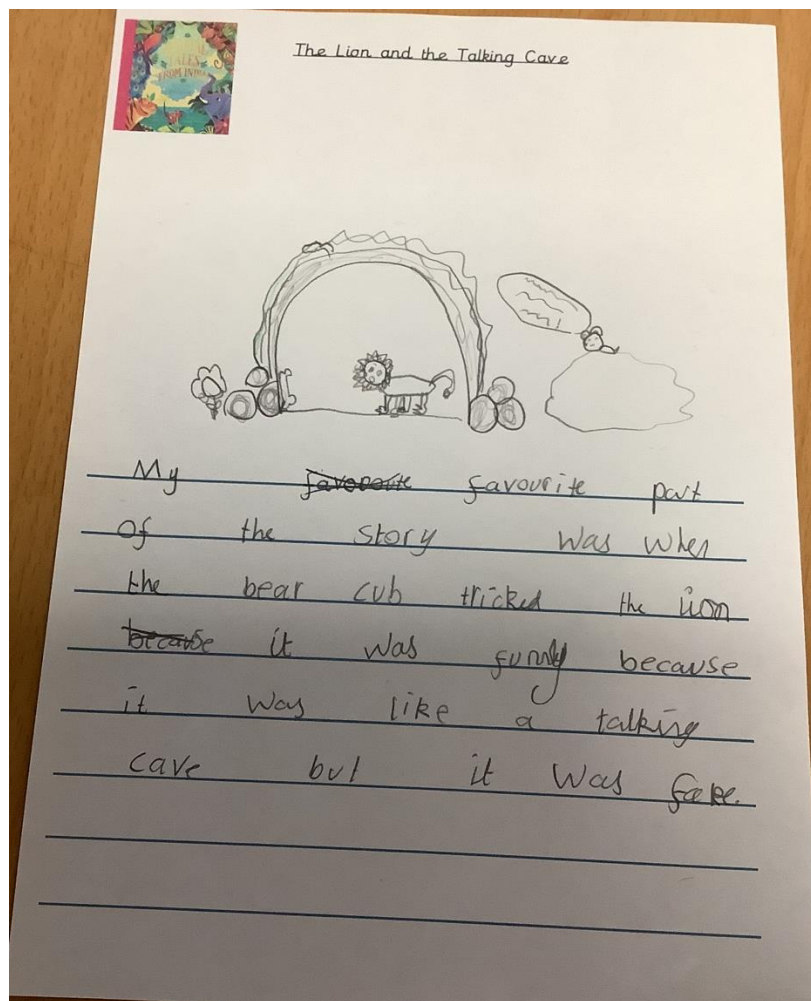
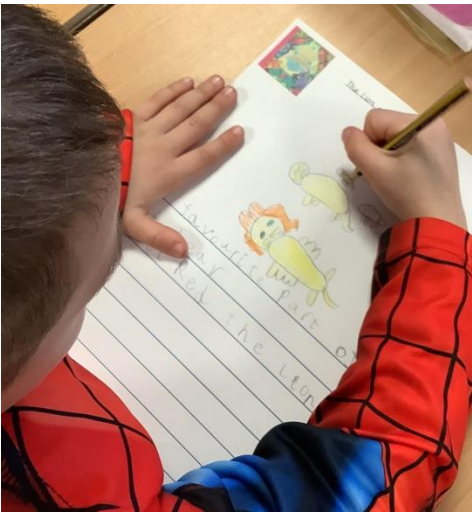
We talked about the

 story.

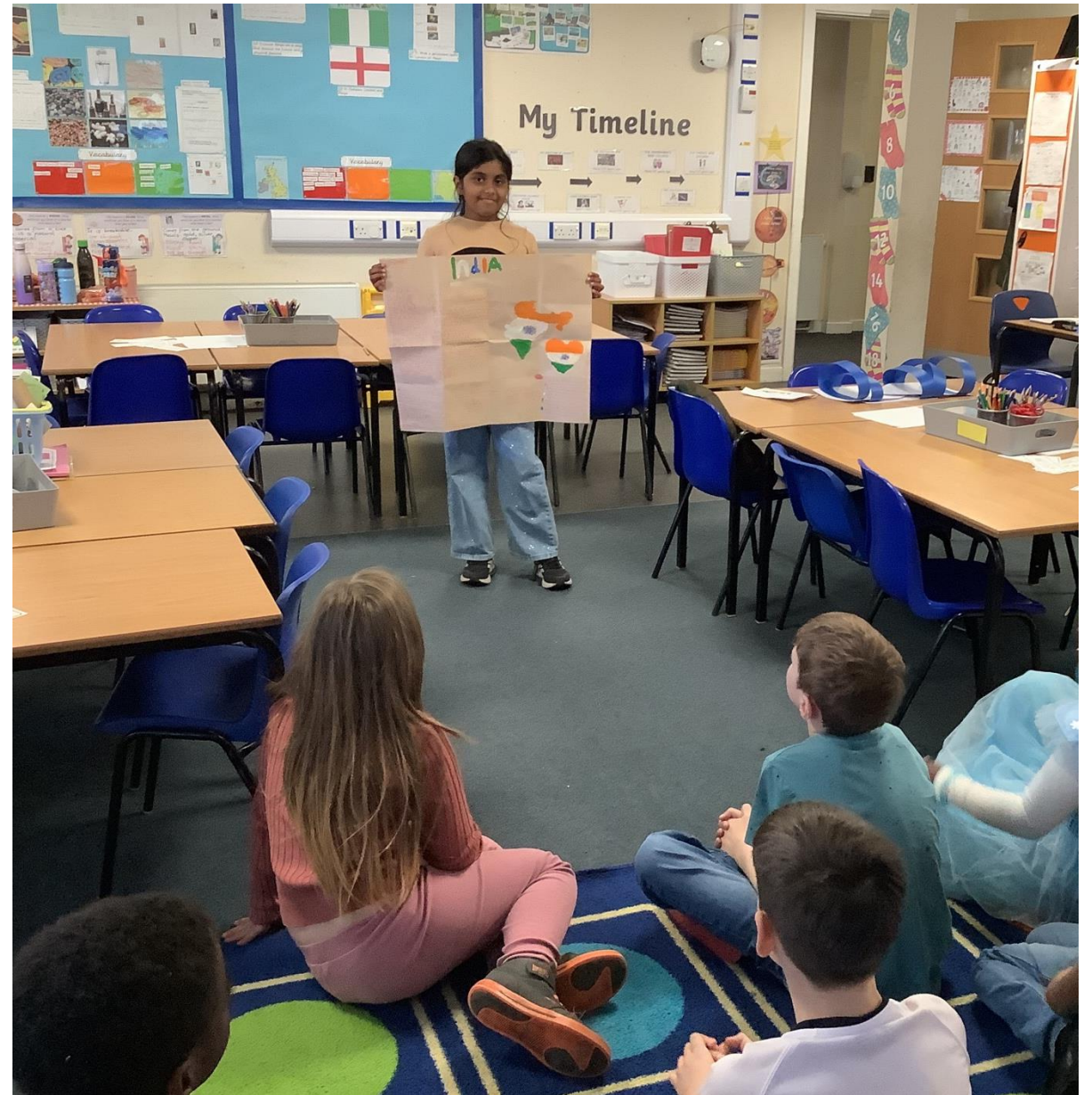
